Random Acts Film Project Media and Community Briefing Luncheon

Washington, DC-- On Thursday, February 22, 2007, Juanita "Busy Bee" Britton, owner of BZB Public Relations; the Anacostia Art Gallery; sponsor of the annual BZB Black Gift and Art Show, an annual event which features exhibitors from across the country, Africa and the Caribbean; and retailer at Reagan National and Dulles International Airports, will introduce her latest project, a documentary film entitled **Random Acts...a documentary of giving**. The event will be held at the Anacostia Community Museum, 1901 Fort Street, SE, at 11am.

At the briefing, Ms. Britton will provide information on the two-week travel itinerary across Africa, and selected filming locations. She will also introduce the eight members of her creative team that will capture the visual journey on film. In addition to the professional team, Ms. Britton is also taking, Telvin Walker, a twelve year old Anacostia Art Gallery apprentice from the Woodland Terrace community in Anacostia.

The Random Acts...a documentary of giving film project will follow an African American woman's travel throughout Senegal, South Africa and Swaziland -- on a path of giving and sharing with women and families in rural African communities. The documentary will track her deliberate mid-life journey as urban socialite and grassroots philanthropist.

The big idea to document such random acts of giving was initiated by a dream Ms. Britton had that moved her so emotionally, that she became determined to do more and "give back" to communities in need, both here and abroad. Her decision to focus on Africa first was in keeping with her many travels to the Continent and her observation of the tremendous opportunity to bring joy and share hope with women and children in rural communities.

"We take a lot for granted in this country; we have a litany of resources that we can draw from when we need food, shelter and clothing. This is not the norm in some parts Africa. All too often there is no one or agency to call upon". She adds that living situations for many people in Africa may be dire. And while there are individuals and organizations that rise above the fray and provide services and solutions, her goal and that of the Random Acts Foundation is to be an organization that fills the gap.

The focus of the documentary will be on Ms. Britton performing random acts of kindness by giving donations to micro-economic projects, African villages and individuals throughout her journey. She also plans to produce a book that depicts her journey from country to country. Her non-profit, The Random Acts Foundation, currently consists of African Americans from all walks of life, whose mission is to make a difference in the lives of others.
