In 1996, Juanita "Busy Bee" Britton, the founder of the Random Acts Foundation of Washington, DC, spent one month in a "health hut" helping a group of women with a start-up baby-weighing and maternal health program in the rural village of Saam Njaay, Senegal. On her visit, ten years later, she was pleased to discover that a five room hospital had been built to replace the hut. Also, now, it has a visiting doctor and full time Registered Nurse. The clinic services over 50 surrounding villages and desperately needs an ambulance, emergency equipment and staff to service critical patients

- \$100-10,000** The estimated cost for delivering the vehicle, necessary trainings, funds and operating costs for a year is approximately \$100,000. Expected delivery, December 2007.
